





	<p>ROBERT PARKER</p>	<p>90 / 91</p> <p>A blend of 80% Merlot and 20% Cabernet Franc, there are approximately 2,000 cases of this fabulous sleeper of the vintage. It exhibits a dark ruby/purple hue along with notes of blueberries, black raspberries, toasted bread and white chocolate. Full-bodied with superb richness, a layered texture, a multidimensional mouth that lasts nearly 40 seconds, It can easily compete with some of the top crus. Consume it over the next decade. 	<p>STEPHAN TANZER</p>	<p>88 / 90</p> <p>Red-ruby. Roasted cherry and raspberry on the nose. Creamy, lush and seamless but not overly sweet. A very broad, concentrated wine with no rough edges, and yet this is a bit youthfully inky today and not yet expressing itself. Tongue-coating tannins will require at least a few years of bottle aging.</p>
